Summary Statement ←————→ Match of Strategies

The Summary Statement is the foundation for building an effective behavior support plan that describes the behavior and the reasons behind its occurrence. The Summary Statement is built from the information in the Behavior Assessment and a description of the Behavior of Concern, underlying conditions, setting events, and triggers, and why the Behavior of Concern happens.

Directions: Fill in Step 1 to develop the summary statement. Use this information in Step 2 to determine strategies to match the need revealed in the reason for the behavior.

Step 1: Writing the Summary Statement

The individual does (behavior)... Behavior of Concern Description of the behavior	Because of these factors or when these factors occur (underlying conditions, setting events, trigger)... When it Happens: Setting events, Triggers	How often (frequency)... How Often it Happens: Frequency	What is the person communicating with the behavior or why does it happen?
